Reconciliation Week

Focus Questions

Discuss the BTN High story as a class and record the main points of discussion. Students will then respond to the following:

- 1. What is reconciliation?
- 2. Why is National Reconciliation Week important? Explain.
- 3. List 3 ways you think Australia could become a more equal and accepting place.
- 4. Why do you think it's important to learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture?
- 5. How does your school support reconciliation?
- 6. How can young people contribute to reconciliation in their schools and communities?

Activities

- Discuss reconciliation in small groups. Record the main points of the discussion on a mind map with 'Reconciliation' at the centre.
- Research key events that have made an impact on the recognition of
 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Create an interactive timeline
 using websites/apps such as <u>Read Write Think</u>, <u>Canva</u> or another of your
 choice.
- Create a biography of a significant Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person who has contributed to the reconciliation process in some way.
- Produce a short video of how your school supports reconciliation. Include interviews with fellow students about what reconciliation means to them.
