## **EPISODES**

## **Episode One:**

Determined to get to know New Zealand before taking on her first film role in the country as a Kiwi nun, Miriam Margolyes embarks on a road trip around the North Island. Beginning in Wellington, the nation's capital, Miriam dives headfirst into the distinct culture of New Zealand today. She discovers a country that is fanatical about rugby – a sport she 'loathes' – and finds it has many other surprises up its sleeve!

Along the way, she discovers an unexpected affinity with hobbits – and uncovers how New Zealand's unique Māori heritage is shaping its identity today.

## **Episode Two:**

Miriam Margolyes heads south on her first New Zealand road-trip. To better understand the country and its people, she confronts the challenges facing the nation today and explores how Kiwis are responding to them.

As intrepid and outspoken as ever, Miriam tackles the issue of gangs, meeting a member of the notorious Mongrel Mob. Following in the footsteps of the character she'll be playing in her first New Zealand film, Miriam ventures into the remote and rugged South Island. Here she comes face-to-face historic rivalries – and finds strength and kindness in the face of adversity.





A veteran of stage and screen, celebrated actor Miriam Margolyes has been coined 'the David Attenborough of humans' for her innate ability to connect with people from all walks of life.

Her extraordinary curiosity and empathy has led Miriam on adventures across numerous countries — including on the award-winning trilogy, *Miriam Margolyes: Almost Australian* (ABC, BBC), *Miriam Margolyes: Australia Unmasked*, which won the 2022 AACTA Award for Best Documentary Series and *Miriam Margolyes: Impossibly Australian* which has been nominated for the 2024 AACTA Award for Best Documentary Series.

Priming her appetite for social commentary and adventure, Miriam's earliest roles were in theatre, where she took the stage in Cambridge Footlights productions. From there she began to take on television roles of increasing significance including Blackadder and the acclaimed BBC adaptation of The Life and Loves of a She-Devil, and film roles including Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets, The Age of Innocence, Romeo and Juliet and Babe.

Known from her many talk show appearances, Miriam has been famously acclaimed by both Graham Norton and Andrew Denton as being one of their all-time favourite guests.

Miriam's relationship to Australia has always been an enduring one, upheld through longstanding relationships with close friends such as the Manning Clark family, Germaine Greer, Clive James and her life partner of 56 years, Heather Sutherland.

Since 2013, Margolyes has also been an Australian citizen, sharing her time between work in Europe and England, and her home in the Southern Highlands of NSW.
