

Educator Notes: Episode 14. Rainforest

In this episode

Vivid green, lush, layered and full of life! The Art Crew explore the wonders of beautiful rainforests as they work on a collaged mural together.

Using upcycled carboard and other loose parts, Zindzi creates a collection of rainforest creatures, including a lurking crocodile and vibrant butterflies!

Material Suggestions

- Large sheet of cardboard (ask around, someone might have a fridge box they could donate)
- Tissue/crepe paper
- Cylinders
- Pegs
- Paper doilies
- Corrugated cardboard
- Hessian/felt/fabric scraps/wool
- Patty pans
- Cartons
- Paste
- Scissors
- Tape





Let's extend

- Find out about the <u>layers of a real rainforest</u>: what is the purpose of each layer and what plants and creatures can be found?
- When setting up, consider sorting materials into colour groups; greens, browns and blues – organised materials promotes focused and thoughtful engagement.
- When the mural is complete, take photographs of each layer and arrange into a display book.
 Include notes about each layer based on your rainforest research. Display for families and children to revisit.
- Encourage children to use water colours to paint their favourite section of the collage. Frame and display alongside the mural.
- Create mini rainforest dioramas in shoe boxes

 incorporate natural materials found outdoors such as sticks, bark and leaves. Don't forget to put natural materials back where you found them in the outdoors when finished.
