

HOW TO make YOUR OWN MR MONKEYJOCKS PUPPET!

These puppet makes are designed for grownups to craft and involve cutting, gluing and sewing, but there are also plenty of fun parts where kids can jump in and help out, too! They can be a bit involved, so look out for our Trifficulty Level as a guide.



MATERIALS

- Body: Yellow fleece
- Stripes: Teal and Cream fleece
- Jocks: White fleece
- Eyes: Black felt
- Yellow, white and teal thread
- Stuffing
 - Optional: Fabric for a royal Mr Monkeyjocks cape
 - Optional: Colouring supplies to decorate his crown

TOOLS

- Mr Monkeyjocks puppet pattern
- Pen for tracing patterns
 - Optional: Chalk for tracing on dark materials
- Scissors
- Fabric glue
- Sewing supplies (needle, pins/clips)
 - Optional: tape for crown



A FEW HELPFUL NOTES:

- When we say to “attach” something to the puppet, feel free to use fabric glue or sewing supplies. Fabric glue will make it a simpler project, sewing will make it a sturdier project.
- If you find the perfect colour in fleece, but we’ve listed felt, the fleece should work just fine. Same for the other way around!
- **If your fabric has a different front and back**, pay attention to this when tracing your patterns. If you need to trace a pattern multiple times on this type of fabric, be sure to flip your pattern over when you trace it a second time. This ensures you get the correct side of the fabric on the outside of your puppet! When sewing these fabric pieces together, place the front side of the fabric on the inside, so that when you turn it right-side out, the correct side of the fabric will appear on the outside! **If your fabric is the same on both sides, you don’t need to worry about this!**
- Over time, some of the stuffing may get compacted or come out of your puppet. Simply replace it with fresh stuffing as needed!

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

BODY

1. Print out the Mr Monkeyjocks puppet pattern from Bluey.TV, and cut out the pattern pieces. Please note that the jocks pattern piece is made of two parts that need to be taped together.
2. Trace the body pattern onto your yellow fleece two times, and cut out the pieces.
3. Sew the body pieces together, leaving the bottom open.
4. Turn the body right-side out and add stuffing to the head.
5. Trace the top chest stripe pattern two times on your teal fleece and cut them out.
6. Attach these stripes to the top of Mr Monkeyjocks' chest, one on the front, and one on the back, by gluing or sewing.
7. Trace the cream chest stripe pattern on your cream fleece and cut it out.
8. Wrap the cream stripe around his chest, directly below the teal stripe. The ends of the cream stripe should meet in the back. Attach it by gluing or sewing.

HEAD

9. Trace the nose pattern two times on your cream fleece and cut them out.
10. Sew around the curve of the nose, leaving a small opening to turn it right-side out.
11. Add stuffing to the nose, and then sew or glue the opening shut.
12. Trace the face pattern on the cream fleece and cut it out.
13. Attach the face fabric to his head by sewing or gluing.
14. Attach the oval nose right beneath the face fabric that you added in the previous step.

LIMBS AND TAIL

15. Trace the "limbs and tail" pattern eight times on your teal fleece and cut them out.
16. Match them up two by two. Sew them together, leaving the top end open.
17. Turn them right-side out and add stuffing. Don't over-stuff them; keep them half-full so they're nice and floppy.
18. Trace the "arm and leg yellow stripe" pattern eight times on your yellow fleece and cut them out.

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

LIMBS AND TAIL

19. Trace the “arm and leg cream stripe” pattern four times on your cream fleece and cut them out.
20. Now we'll attach three stripes to each limb. The cream stripe goes on the centre of the limb, and with one yellow stripe directly above it and one yellow stripe directly below it. You can glue or sew them on. Note: Once you wrap one stripe around, the place where those ends meet can be the “back” of the limb. For a smoother look, make sure all your stripe ends wrap around to meet at the back.
(Pro-tip: Even if you glue on your stripes, they will end up looking more cohesive if you sew the edges of the stripes together. This is optional and can be done at a later time!)
21. Grab two limbs: these are now his arms! Set the two other limbs aside for later.
22. Close the openings on both arms by gluing or sewing. Then you can attach them to his body! Place the arms on the sides of his body, lined up with the top of the teal stripe on his chest. Sew or glue them in place.
23. Trace the “limbs and tail” pattern onto your cream fleece two times and cut it out. This is his tail!
24. Sew around the edges of the tail, leaving the top open.
25. Turn the tail right-side out and add stuffing. It should be half-full, like the limbs.
26. Trace the tail stripe pattern on your yellow fleece and teal fleece. Cut them out.
27. Wrap the stripes around the monkey tail, with green at the very top and yellow right below that. Attach them by sewing or gluing. Set the tail aside for now.

JOCKS

28. Trace the jocks pattern on your white fleece and cut it out.
29. Trace the jocks front rectangle pattern on your white fleece and cut it out.
30. Attach the tall front rectangle in the centre of the jocks, so the bottom is in line with the bottom of the jocks (you can use the centre mark on your jocks pattern piece as reference)
31. Add a line of glue to the top of the jocks, and fold it over so it just meets the top of the rectangle. This creates a waistband.
32. Wrap the jocks around his belly and attach them so the ends meet in the back. Make sure the waistband is at the top!

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

JOCKS

33. Attach the legs to both sides of the jocks, close to the waistband. You can sew or glue them on.
(Pro-tip: It will help the legs look like they're sticking out of the jocks if you attach them as full circles, rather than squishing the top of the legs into a line.)
34. Attach the tail to the back of the jocks.

FACE

35. Trace the ear pattern four times on your teal fleece and cut them out.
36. Sew around the curve, leaving the base of the ear open.
37. Turn them right-side out and add stuffing.
38. Attach the base of each ear to both sides of his head by glueing or sewing.
39. Trace the inner ear pattern two times on your cream fleece and cut them out.
40. Attach them to the front of each ear.
41. Trace the eye pattern two times on black felt and cut them out.
(Pro tip: if it's hard to see your pen line, you can use chalk or simply pin the pattern to the felt and cut around it.)
42. Trace the nostril pattern two times on your black felt and cut them out.
Set them aside for now.
43. Trace the smile pattern on your black felt and cut it out.
44. Arrange the eyes, nostrils, and smile on his face, using his picture as a guide.
The eyes can be placed right above the nose. The nostrils go on the nose, near the top, and the smile goes on the nose, near the bottom. Once the placement looks right, you can attach them.

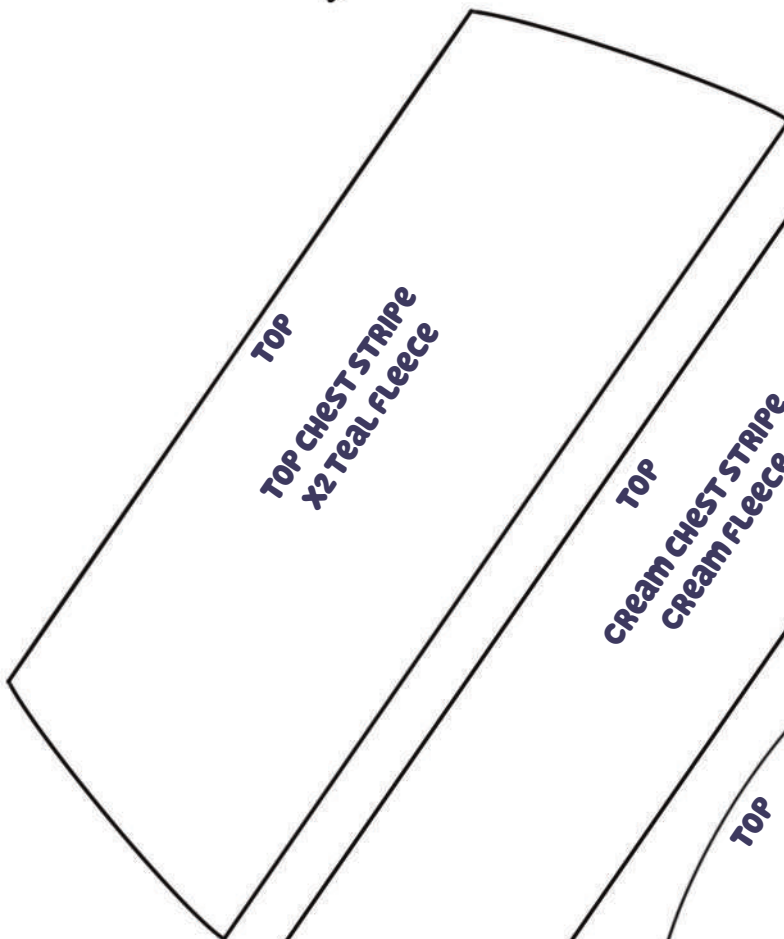
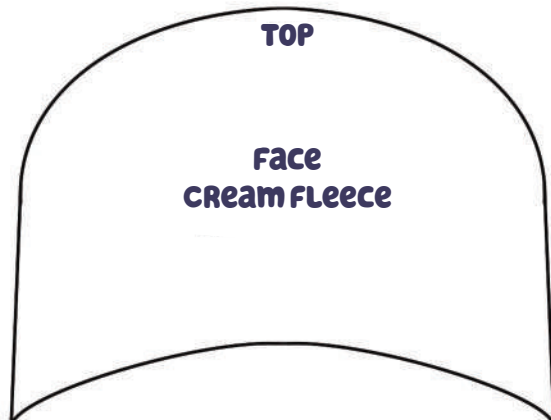
He deserves extra-special treatment from his monkey butlers, so feel free to cut out and colour in his crown on the pattern page!

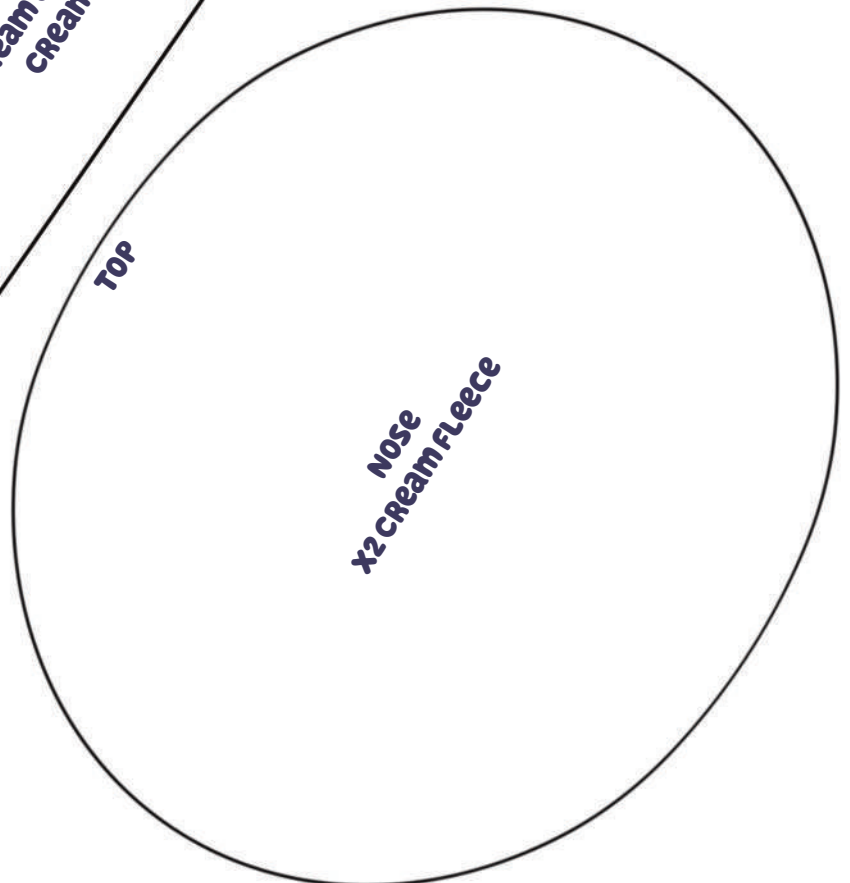

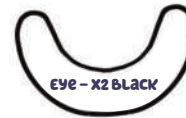

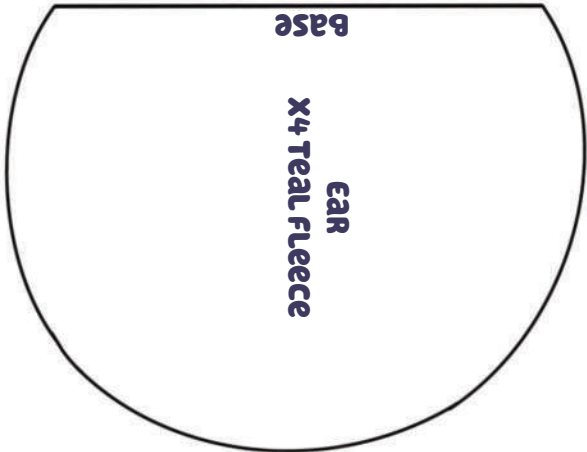

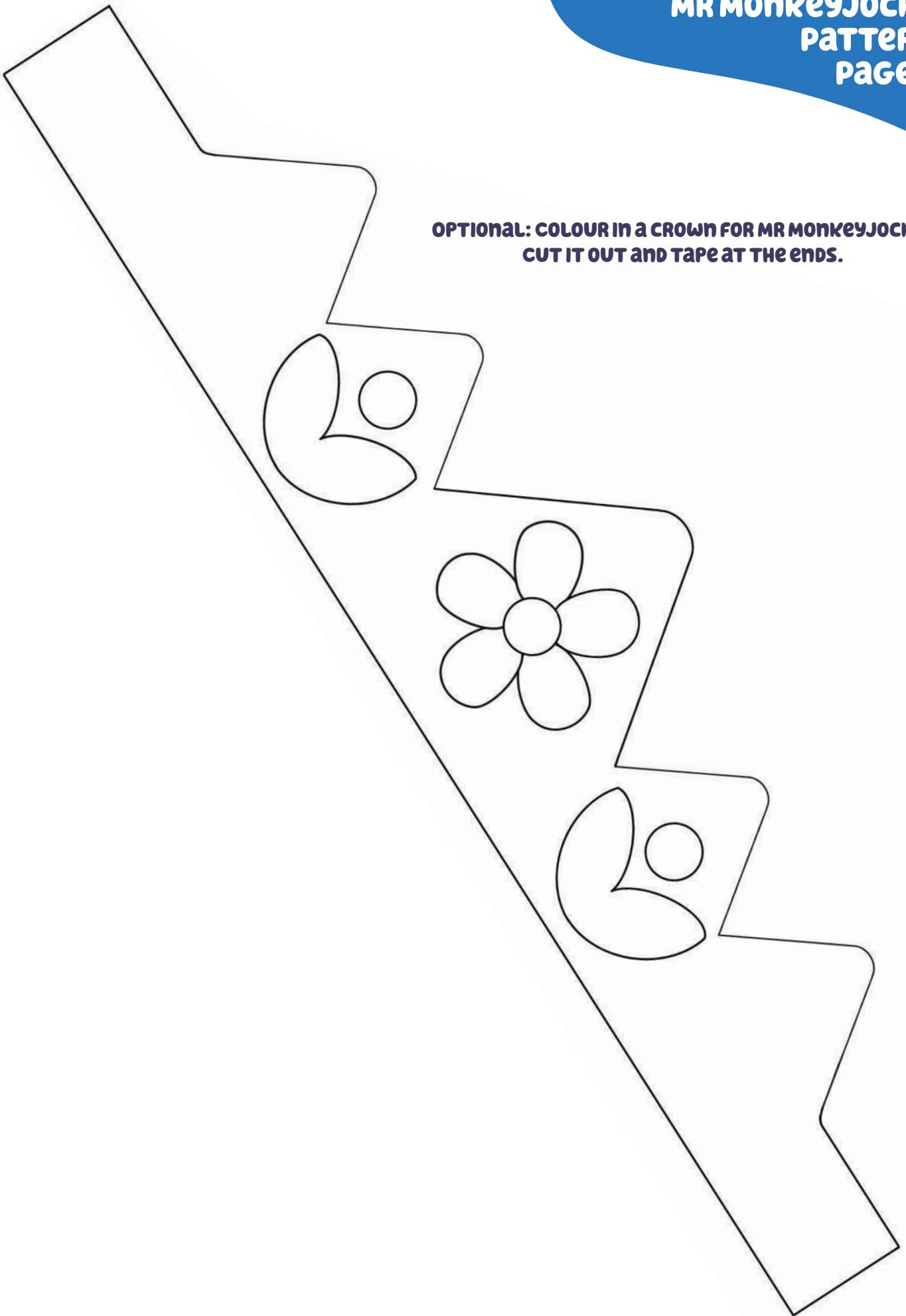
ARM AND LEG CREAM STRIPES
