Milton Terrace

At the foot of the Sydney Harbour Bridge and within view of the iconic Opera House sits a crumbling historic terrace on the verge of a dramatic and opulent restoration.

Egan House

Restoring dishevelled Grimes Cottage in the heart of Sydney's historical district 'The Rocks', Karen and John navigate a minefield of heritage protection as they seek to transform one of Sydney's oldest houses into a grand family home.

Cooroy Queenslander

Will a young family who fall for a derelict old Queenslander set in the rolling green hills of the Noosa hinterland lose their spark, when money and time threaten to drag their dream restoration on for years?

Mittagong Buildings

A couple from the Southern Highlands engage a creative builder to piece together two old structures with very different pasts – an old sawmill and a miner's cottage – into one eclectic and wonderful home.
