These students embark on the most thrilling and dangerous training course

Australia has to offer: learning how to handle, farm and manage the world's oldest
and largest living reptile - the saltwater crocodile.

CROC COLLEGE is not for the faint hearted. Under the guidance of world renowned croc expert John Lever, the students learn how to capture and move crocodiles, collect their eggs, and raise their babies. They're taught to interpret the animals' behaviour; prepare their food; capture them in the wild; and butcher and skin adult crocs for meat and leather. They also study the sometimes ethically confronting business side of crocodile farming.

Almost every day the students risk both life and limb. Not only that, it's oppressively hot, and the students live in close confines in a tin shed on the property over the three-week course.



Their nerve-wracking, action packed, emotional journey reaches its height when two of the best students learn how to capture crocs in the wild. In daring raids, the students also collect eggs from wild, remote croc nests.

For all six students, CROC COLLEGE is a once in a lifetime adventure, and while some of them dream of becoming full-time croc-wranglers, others are at Australia's scariest school for entirely different reasons. One way or another, CROC COLLEGE will change their lives forever.
