Statement from the Game Meats Company of Australia (GMCA)

The Game Meats Company of Australia (**GMCA**) is pleased with the outcome of the recent decision of the Full Court of the Federal Court of Australia.

GMCA operates a lawful business and has always sought to and will continue to conduct its business in accordance with the law in what is a highly regulated industry.

The film images captured by Farm Transparency International (**FTI**) during 2024 were obtained as a consequence of its representatives unlawfully breaking into and entering upon GMCA's secured private facility in the dark of night and further trespassing by covertly installing remote cameras to record GMCA's lawful business undertaking, without GMCA's knowledge or permission. FTI is a political activist group whose objective is to end all forms of human consumption of animals and use by humans of animal by-products – it is not a recognised media organisation or an official law enforcement authority. Like any commercial or private property owner or lessee, GMCA is legally entitled to control who enters its property and who does not and as such, GMCA has sought to uphold its legal rights as it is entitled to do.

FTI has informed GMCA that it intends to appeal the decision of the Full Court of the Federal Court of Australia to the High Court of Australia and accordingly, GMCA will not be making any further comment while this matter remains before the Courts.
