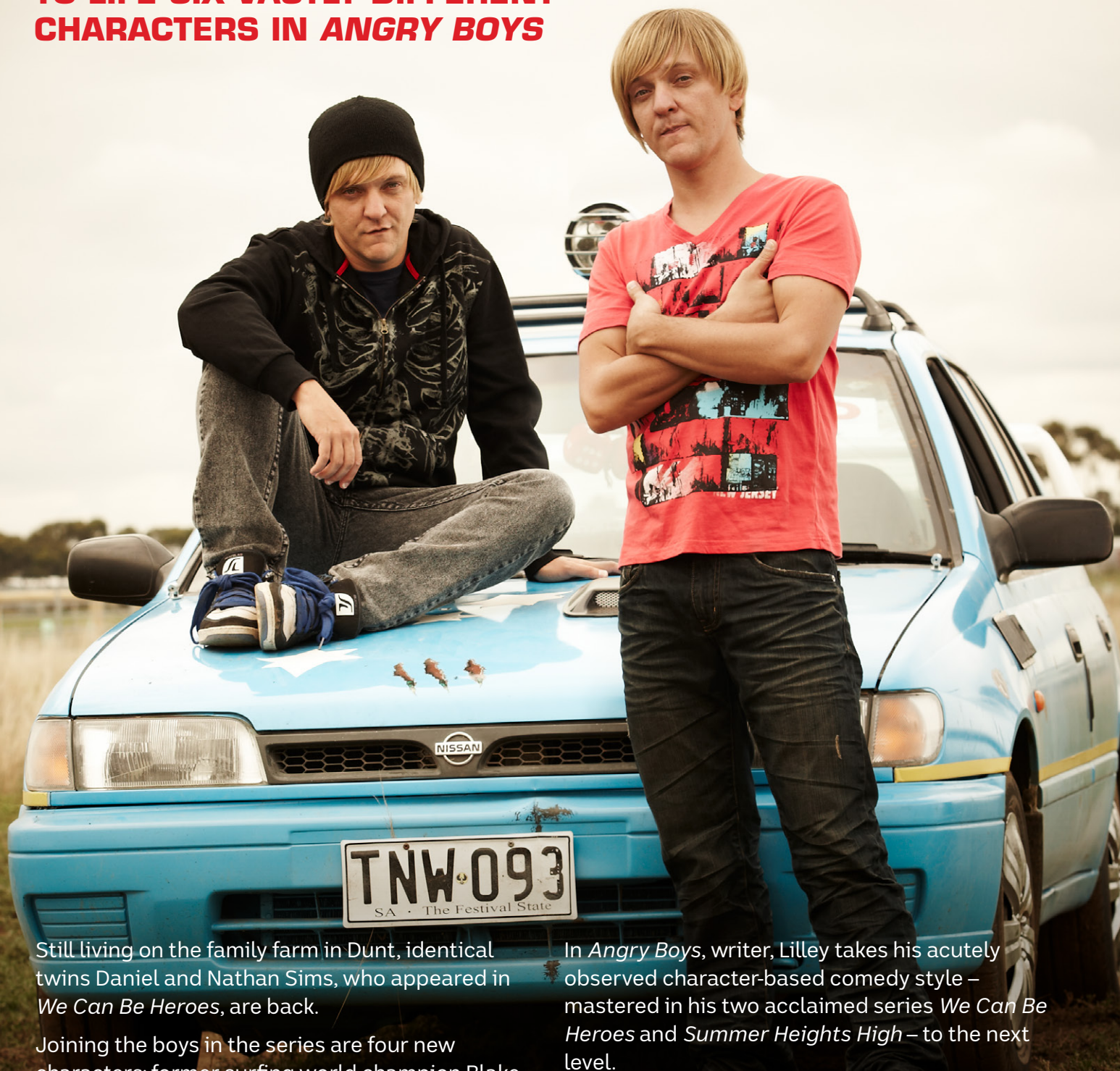

Still living on the family farm in Dunt, identical twins Daniel and Nathan Sims, who appeared in *We Can Be Heroes*, are back.

Joining the boys in the series are four new characters; former surfing world champion Blake Oakfield, a family man and founding member of a surfer gang – the Mucca Mad Boys; S.mouse a U.S. rapper famous for having produced the biggest selling hip-hop single of all time; Japanese mother Jen Okazaki, a shrewd businesswoman, she also manages her son's skateboarding career; and Juvenile Justice Centre for Boys officer Ruth Sims, aka Gran. Gran takes pride in looking after the 'worst boys in the state' and can be as tough on the boys as she is kind to them.

In *Angry Boys*, writer, Lilley takes his acutely observed character-based comedy style – mastered in his two acclaimed series *We Can Be Heroes* and *Summer Heights High* – to the next level.

Filmed in over 70 locations across three countries and featuring an enormous cast, *Angry Boys* made entertainment history by being the first Australian series to be co-produced by ABC TV in Australia, HBO in the US and pre-sold to the BBC in the UK.

EPISODE SYNOPSIS

EPISODE 1

Meet Daniel and Nathan Sims, 17-year-old identical twins who live on a farm in Dunt, South Australia and their Grandmother, Ruth Sims, a 65 year prison guard who works at a juvenile justice centre for boys.

EPISODE 2

Meet Daniel and Nathan's favourite rapper S.mouse, the biggest selling hip-hop artist of all time, who finds himself under house arrest at his parent's house after poo-ing on a police car.

EPISODE 3

Meet Daniel and Nathan's favourite surfer, ex-surf champion Blake Oakfield who gave up surfing after his balls were shot off in order to focus on his responsibilities as gang leader of the Mucca Mad Boys.

EPISODE 4

Meet Daniel and Nathan's favourite skateboarder, Japanese teenager Tim Okazaki, and his domineering manager/mother, Jen.

Daniel seeks revenge on Nathan for pissing on him in a game called Piss Funny. Tim is unimpressed with the new range of Gaystyle lickable shoes and S.mouse sets up home recording studio.

EPISODE 6

Blake sets up a Fat Boys Surf School, proving he is a responsible husband; Gran takes a young boy on her 'Scaring Young Boys' tour of the prison; Daniel throws a party for all the teenagers in Dunt.

EPISODE 7

Daniel is forced to entertain a local gay youth. Jen revokes a Tim Okazaki cartoon in order to relieve his depression. S.mouse fulfills his community service by performing his new songs to an unimpressed audience at an elementary school.

EPISODE 8

Blake's loyalties are tested when a former Mucca Mad Boy seeks revenge on Packo for shooting Blake's balls off. Gran reveals a huge secret to Talib after his mother doesn't turn up for the prison Family Day. Jealous of Nathan's popularity with the girls, Daniel pretends to be his twin brother in order to score the hottest girl in Dunt.

ABOUT CHRIS LILLEY

As a writer, performer, producer, director and composer, Chris Lilley is one of Australia's most prolific artists and the creator of four critically acclaimed television series.

Chris' series, *Ja'mie: Private School Girl* aired in late 2013 and early 2014 on the ABC, BBC and HBO. The series received nominations for Most Popular Light Entertainment Program, Most Outstanding Actor and Most Popular Actor at the 2014 Logie Awards.

Summer Heights High was one of the highest-rated series of 2007 and became the biggest-selling TV series of all time in Australia. Chris was awarded AFI Awards for Best Comedy Series, Best Performance in a Television Comedy and the Byron Kennedy Award for *Summer Heights High*. He wrote much of the music for the series and released the single 'Naughty Girl', which became one of the highest-selling singles of 2008.

In 2005, Chris received international acclaim for his portrayal of five nominees in the ABC comedy *We Can Be Heroes*. Creating and writing the series, Chris won the international Rose d'Or Award for Best Male Comedy Performance as well as Logie Awards for Most Outstanding New Talent and Best Comedy Series and the NSW Premiers Literary Award for Best Script Writing. The series also received nominations for four AFI awards, including Best Comedy Series, Best Screenplay for Television and Best Lead Male Actor.

Chris began his career as a stand-up comedian and voiceover artist. He expanded to television and gained a cult following for his characters 'Extreme Darren' and 'Mr. G' in the sketch comedy series *Big Bite* and Hamish and Andy on the Seven Network.
