STOLEN WAGES REPARATION PAYMENTS

RECOMMENDATION

That you endorse the attached Stolen Wages Reparation Scheme WA Assessment and Payment Process document (Attachment 1).

ISSUE

 Stolen wages reparation payments will be made in accordance with the Assessment and Payment Process document (Attachment 1).

BACKGROUND

- o The State Government approved that reparation payments should be made to Aboriginal people still living who were born prior to 1958 and who experienced direct Government control over their income while resident at Government native welfare settlements in WA, including Moore River Native Settlement, Carrolup, Moola Bulla Station and Sister Kate's home.
- The Department of Indigenous Affairs (DIA) has been tasked with implementing the Stolen Wages Reparation Scheme WA (the Scheme) and has established operational procedures for this purpose.
- In developing the Scheme's operational procedures consideration was given to the Cabinet Decision Sheet. Potential inconsistencies in the wording of the Cabinet Decision Sheet were identified, in that Sister Kate's Home was not a Government institution. The DIA Policy branch has reviewed a comprehensive list of welfare institutions in WA and developed a list of institutions, based on the characteristics of the sample locations in the Cabinet Decision Sheet, that are recommended as suitable for inclusion as eligible institutions.

CURRENT SITUATION

- Four categories of institutions have been identified:
 - 1. Institutions approved in the Cabinet Decision Sheet.
 - Institutions that include Government Native Welfare Settlements and, those that
 were not under State Government control but align themselves with the
 reasoning for Sister Kate's inclusion in the Cabinet Decision Sheet i.e. these
 institutions were subject to Native Welfare legislation under which residents may
 have been required to work.
 - 3. Institutions for which further research is required to determine their eligibility and, institutions that closed at a time such that it is unlikely that anyone resident at them will still be living.

- 4. Institutions that opened after 1972 and are therefore not in scope for the purposes of the Scheme.
- In relation to tax and benefit payment implications for applicants, DIA appointed Price Waterhouse Coopers (PWC) to:
 - o lodge a Class Ruling Application with the Australian Taxation Office in relation to possible income tax and capital gains implications. The ruling has now been approved and will be published on 13 June 2012; and
 - o lodge a Request for a Section 8 (11) for Lump Sum Payment Determination of Exemption Under the Social Security Act 1991 with the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FaHCSIA). This exemption, which includes sign-off from other relevant social security agencies (Department of Veterans' Affairs and the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations), has been approved and was published on 29 May 2012.
- PWC has advised that the earliest date on which DIA can commence payments is the day after which all rulings have been published. At this stage, payments will commence on 14 June 2012, unless the above dates are revised.

1 INTRODUCTION

This document outlines the assessment and payment process for the Stolen Wages Reparation Scheme WA.

2 ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Appendix 1 details the assessment and payment process.

Once an application is received, the Stolen Wages team will:

- 1. Register the application (refer Appendix 2);
- 2. Assess the application for eligibility (refer Appendix 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7);
- 3. Advise the applicant of the outcome in writing (refer Appendix 8 and 9);
- 4. Make payment to the applicant if deemed eligible; and
- 5. Resolve disputes if required.

3 CATEGORIES OF INSTITUTIONS

Four categories of institutions have been identified as per the table below. Further information in relation to the institutions in each category is detailed in Appendix 4.

4 PAYMENT PROCESS

The Finance Branch has established a process to pay applicants through Shared Services via EFT within a week of receiving notification from the assessors.

5 COMPLAINT RESOLUTION

In accordance with the Stolen Wages Reparation Scheme WA Guidelines the quantum of the Ex gratia payment cannot be the subject of a complaint by an Applicant. An Applicant's complaint shall only be made on the following grounds:

- (a) an error of process occurred; and/or
- (b) an error of fact was made.

An Applicant may make a complaint to the Stolen Wages Reparation Scheme WA Complaints Manager who will seek to resolve the complaint at the operational level.

If the complaint cannot be resolved at the operational level the Application will be remitted to a Review Panel for further review. A determination shall be made by the Review Panel to either dismiss the complaint or substitute their own decision.

If an Applicant is not satisfied with the outcome of their complaint they have available to them a complaints process with the Western Australian State Ombudsman's office under the provisions of the *Parliamentary Commissioners Act 1971*.

6 RECORDS MANAGEMENT


Applications are recorded on TRIM and application data is recorded in Access. TRIM, Access, and the applicants' physical files are only accessed by staff working directly on the Scheme.

During the assessment process, applicants' physical files are secured in a locked cabinet in the Policy Branch. After assessments and payments are finalised, applicants' electronic and physical files will be managed by the Records Branch and in accordance with the Department's Retention and Disposal Schedule.

APPENDIX 1: REGISTRATION, ASSESSMENT AND PAYMENT PROCESS




APPENDIX 2: RECEIPT AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

- 1. Application delivered to Records Branch (RB).
- 2. RB delivers unopened Application to Senior Project Officer's (SPO) **IN-TRAY SW APPLICATIONS**.
- 3. SPO date stamps each page of the Application and checks for sensitive information:
 - a. No sensitive information (Go to 4); or
 - b. Yes, sensitive information (e.g. application may include statements of abuse, and/or requests for female or male persons only to read application):
 - i. SPO alerts RB by note on application front page or envelope (Go to 4); or
 - ii. SPO raises issue with Project Director for advice on how to proceed, and upon advice (Go to 4).
- 4. SPO returns Application to RB for TRIM recording.
- 5. RB adds TRIM No. to text box on the top right of page 3 in Application form before scanning see below (NB: TRIM No. will be the Application Reference Number).

- 6. RB creates physical file (NB: for sensitive files, RB will place a sticker on the front of the file to alert all staff).
- 7. RB assigns files to **Stolen Wages Cabinet** in TRIM, and delivers physical files to SPO.
- 8. SPO assigns files to Helpline staff to enter data into Access (NB: for sensitive applications, SPO will assign to appropriate staff member).
- 9. Helpline (HL) staff enter data into Access and conduct Pre-Assessment check to determine whether Application is complete or incomplete.
 - Born before 1958;
 - Applicant details correct;
 - Place of residency;
 - Payment authorisation;
 - Applicant signed;
 - Witness authorisation;
 - 2 x 2 certified identification; or,
 - 2 x referee Statutory Declaration from 2 different referees; and signed by Applicant; and witnessed by someone who is not the referee or the Applicant.
- 10.HL generates an Acknowledgement letter for signing by Project Director.
- 11.HL assigns file to Stolen Wages Cabinet for assessment.

YOUR RIGHTS

Section 39 of the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* specifies a person's right to have the initial decision reviewed by the agency. Section 40 of the Act lists a number of criteria which the application for review must comply with. Both Sections have been reprinted here. Note, there is no charge for an internal review.

Freedom of Information Act 1992

Division 5 - Internal review of decisions as to access

Right to review

- 39. (1) A person who is aggrieved by a decision made by an agency under this Part in relation to an access application has a right to have the decision reviewed by the agency.
 - (2) A person is aggrieved by a decision -
 - (a) if the person is the access applicant and the effect of the decision is to -
 - (i) give access to an edited copy of a document;
 - (ii) refuse to deal with the access applicant;
 - (iii) refuse access to a document;
 - (iv) defer the giving of access to a document;
 - (v) give access to a document in the manner referred to in section 28 or withhold access under that section; or
 - (vi) impose a charge, or require a deposit, that the applicant considers to be unreasonable:

or

- (b) if the person is a third party whose views were or should have been obtained under section 32 or 33, and the decision conflicts with the person's views.
- (3) Review under this Division is not available in respect of -
 - (a) a decision made by an agency's principal officer; or
 - (b) a decision made on an application for review under this Division.

Application for review

- 40. (1) An application for review has to -
 - (a) be in writing;
 - (b) give particulars of the decision which the aggrieved person wishes to have reviewed;
 - (c) give an address in Australia to which notices under this Act can be sent;
 - (d) give any other information or details required under the regulations; and
 - (e) be lodged at an office of the agency.
 - (2) An aggrieved person may lodge an application for review within 30 days after being given written notice of the decision.
 - (3) If the application for review is made by the access applicant the principal officer of the agency may allow the application to be lodged after the period mentioned in subsection (2) has expired.
