Focus Questions

Discuss the BTN High story as a class and record the main points of discussion. Students will then respond to the following:

- 1. What does UV stand for?
- 2. Which country has the highest rates of melanoma in the world?
- 3. What is the biggest cause of melanoma?
- 4. How many Australians are likely to be diagnosed with some form of skin cancer in their lifetime?
- 5. Based on recent research from the Department of Health, what percentage of young Aussies *don't* think they're at risk of developing skin cancer?
 - a. 24%
 - b. 54%
 - c. 74%
- 6. How many types of skin cancers are there?
- 7. Can you name them?
- 8. What are the 5 forms of sun protection?
- 9. What do you do to stay safe in the sun?
- 10. What kinds of sun safety campaigns do you think would be beneficial to young Australians?

Activities

- Research Australia's sun safety campaigns of the past and present.
 In your opinion, explain which ones have the most impact.
- Create a brochure for young people that promotes sun safety.
- Design a tool or strategy that could be used to record or track your UV exposure.
- Create a social media campaign/video to educate teenagers on how to protect themselves from sun exposure.
- Research and write a report about a sun safety campaign from another country. Explain the similarities and/or differences to Australia's sun safety campaigns in the past/present.
