Term 2 Challenge LOWER SECONDARY

21 APR - 4 JUL 2025

Is there an issue or topic you feel isn't being appropriately addressed? Are there specific actions that someone could do to change or fix that issue? If you could, what would you say to them to try to get them to make that change?

The prompt:

In this Challenge, write an open letter to an individual or group who you think can make a difference on an issue or topic that is important to you. Let them know why you think this and what they could do to make that change.

Have a clear purpose, reason or goal for your open letter. Think about and write for the specific audience you want to reach with your letter.

Support your arguments with evidence.

In this Challenge, you can choose to create either a photo essay (5-6 photos with captions) or a radio news story (no more than 2 minutes) to inform us about a topic or issue that interests you and which you think other people should know about.

Build from your own experiences.

Use different techniques to create emotion and engagement.

Keep the story simple – think about what your audience needs to know.

Be creative and have fun.

- Your photo essay or radio news story must be your own work. You can't copy from anywhere else or use AI or copyright material to create it.
- You can work by yourself or in groups of up to four, but you can only enter once.
