
Na-ba gua-ta - rè na-ba gua-ta - rè La - gèr i - ko - mi na-ba gua-ta - rè

Naba Guatarè (*pronounced naba gwa-ta-reh*) is a song about pulling ropes, for tug-of-war as well as pulling pearl-divers out of the water on to the deck of a pearl lugger.

Elders and cultural custodians of this song from Mer Island (Murray Island) have kindly given permission for this song to be taught and sung for educational purposes.

They also gave permission for ABC *Let's Sing* and *Music in Me* to use the song for on-screen and/or educational purposes.

Copyright remains with the Mer (Meriam) people of Mer Island (Murray Island).
