

Educator Notes: Episode 18. Paper World

In this episode

A simple piece of paper can offer so many possibilities! Inspired by the creations of paper engineer <u>Benja Harney</u>, the Art Crew explore ways to represent ideas with paper.

The children cut, draw, paint, and paste to make life sized paper people. While Zindzi shows us how to makes a 3D paper plant and cloud sculptures.

Material Suggestions

- Butcher's paper
- Paint
- Paste
- Thick black markers
- Scrap paper

Let's extend

- Try making accordian paper chains. Start with simple shapes, then build up to more complex cutting projects depending on interest and ability of children (stars, people and flowers).
- Introduce children to the curly paper craft world of quilling; there are hundreds of examples and ideas to check out online. Try basic quilling techniques as an interesting fine motor challenge. Focus on pattern making and composition with a variety of paper colours and thicknesses.
- Explore symmetrical pattern making with paper folding and cutting projects. Start with paper squares, fold a few times corner to corner, then cut into the folds. Open to reveal pattern then mount on a contrasting coloured square to display.
